Members who have returned the 1st circular for the 1978 International Sedimentological Congress in Israel should receive the 2nd circular towards the end of September. Remember you do not need to send registration fees when you return the 1st circular.

With the Congress less than a year ahead it is time to remind members that the new Bureau and Council will be elected at the General Assembly held during the Congress. Elections will take place for the post of President, Vice-Presidents, General Secretary, Treasurer, Editor, Publications Secretary and six other members of Council.

The present Bureau is required by the Statutes to act as a Nominating Committee by preparing a list of nominations for Council who will propose a list for the Assembly to vote upon. However members of the Association may individually make proposals provided the names reach the General Secretary at least one month before the Assembly or, if submitted at the Assembly, there are at least 50 signatures of members.

The General Secretary and the Editors have said that they do not wish to seek re-election; the President is not eligible for re-election; and all other members of Council have to be re-elected.

So, if you have suggestions of people whom you think may be suitable for posts on the Council, send their names to the General Secretary as soon as possible. The Bureau will firstly consider the names as possibilities for nomination and secondly, if the individual is not nominated by the Bureau, then the name can nevertheless go forward as an independent proposal.

In addition, the General Assembly is the place where the Statutes and By-Laws are changed. If you have any proposals for revisions these must reach the General Secretary at least 6 months before the General Assembly. Enclosed with this Newsletter is a copy of the present Statutes.
