• ANNOUNCING: 34th IAS Meeting of Sedimentology, Rome (Italy)

The **34th IAS International Meeting of Sedimentology** will take place in **Rome** (Italy) between the **10th** – **13th September 2019**. The theme of the meeting, 'Sedimentology to face societal challenges on risk, resources and record of the past', reflects a desire to discuss, compare and promote research in the context of societal changes from the perspective of Sedimentology and Sedimentary Geology. The call for proposals for **Sessions**, **Workshops and Short Courses** is currently open! Deadline for submitting proposals is **31 October 2018**.

RECAP of the 20th International Sedimentological Congress, Quebec (Canada)

From 13th–17th August 2018, more than 900 sedimentologists from 51 different countries convened in Quebec, Canada to participate in the 20th International Sedimentological Congress. The next generation of geoscientists was well represented with 294 students and 140 Early Career Scientists attending the meeting. The organizing committee prepared an exciting program with a wide array of topical sessions, field trips, short courses, and social activities.

Eight parallel scientific sessions were organized under six themes: The carbonate depositional system, The clastic depositional system, Paleo-environments and Paleo-climates, Sedimentary Processes, and Applied sedimentology. In total, participants presented 536 oral, 161 short oral and 467 poster presentations.

• CALL for applications for IAS Post-Doctoral Research Grants (Fall 2018 Session)

IAS Post-Doctoral Research Grants are intended as a seed to assist early-career post-doctoral researchers in either establishing a proof of concept, in order to support applications to national research funding bodies, or to fund areas of a project that were not included in the original project scope.

Up to 4 grants, each to a maximum of 2500 Euro, are awarded twice per year to Early Career IAS members – those that have secured their Ph.D. within the previous 7 years.

The application requires submission of a research proposal with budget and CV (template provided on the **submission webpage**), and a letter of support from the researcher's supervisor, line manager or Head of School. More details about the application procedure can be found **here**. Application deadline for the Fall 2018 Session is **30 September 2018**.

Eligibility:

- Applicants must be full members of the IAS.
- Applicants must have secured their Ph.D. within the previous 7 years.
- Applicants can only benefit from a Post-Doctoral grant on one occasion.

CALL for applications for Post-Graduate Research Grants (Fall 2018 Session)

Up to **10 research grants**, each of about 1000 Euro, are awarded twice a year to **IAS Post-Graduate Student Members**. This grant scheme is designed to support PhD students in their studies and research. Post-Graduate Research Grants can be used to (co-)finance fieldwork, acquisition and analysis of data, visits to other institutes to use specialized facilities, etc.

Applications have to be submitted via the IAS website. Application deadline for the Fall 2018 Session is **30 September 2018**.

CALL for applications for Institutional Grants (Fall 2018 Session)

Twice a year, IAS awards an **Institutional Grant** of about 10,000 Euro, which is intended to support capacity building initiatives in less developed countries (LDCs). Grants will allow earth science departments in LDCs to acquire durable sedimentological equipment for teaching and research, or tools that can be used by all geology students. The grant application should thus clearly demonstrate how the grant will increase the recipient's capacity to teach sedimentology at undergraduate level in a sustainable way.

Applications have to be submitted via the IAS website. Application deadline for the Fall 2018 Session is **30 September 2018**.

CALL for nominations for the Richard W. Faas Research Prize

IAS and the Faas family **invite nominations for the 2019 Richard W. Faas Research Prize**. The prize will be awarded during the 34th IAS International Meeting of Sedimentology, Rome, Italy (10–13 September 2019) and will recognise outstanding work in the field of marine sedimentology and particularly research dealing with fine–grained marine and estuarine sediments. PhD students and post–doctoral researchers can be nominated. Candidates should have obtained their PhD not more than 5 years before the date of the award ceremony, i.e. the annual meeting of the IAS.

Application rules and eligibility criteria for IAS Student Travel Grants:

- Applicants must be active IAS Student Members at the time of submitting a travel grant application;
- Applicants can apply for a travel grant twice per calendar year: once for an IAS meeting (IMS or ISC) and once for any other IAS-sponsored meeting;

• Applicants must have an active and approved (oral or poster) presentation at the meeting (unless the meeting format does not include oral or poster presentations), on a topic of sedimentological relevance.
