#### Launching the Judith McKenzie Field Work Award

The IAS is delighted to launch the **Judith McKenzie Field Work Award**. This new award aims to promote sedimentological field observations for the newest generation of Earth Scientists – MSc Students. The funding behind this award was donated by Judith McKenzie, coming from the IUGS Emile Argand Award, presented to her in 2016.

Judith McKenzie is Professor Emeritus of Earth System Sciences in the Geological Institute, Department of Earth Science at ETH Zürich, past IASpresident and founder of the IAS Summer Schools.



Up to 5 awards of €300 each, will be awarded twice per year to IAS student members. Since the award is only available for MSc students, proof of student status will be required. The awardee shall also receive a one-year IAS student membership, upon submission of their MSc thesis.

Applicants should apply for the Judith McKenzie Field Work Award via the <u>IAS website here</u>. The application requires submission of a grant proposal (written by the student) with budget and CV (template provided on the submission webpage), and a signed letter of recommendation from the student's supervisor.

#### Call for nominations for the Sun Shu Prizes

The call for nominations for the recently announced IAS Sun Shu Prize China and Sun Shu Prize International is now open. These two prizes are awarded to recognise outstanding scientists in the field of sedimentology. The Prizes are awarded to honour the late Prof. Sun Shu, a Chinese sedimentologist whose success and fame was achieved through the integration of sedimentological analysis into numerous areas of research including sedimentary geotectonics, mineral resources, and environmental sciences. Prof. Shu was a true pioneer in terms of using tectonic facies analysis concepts and sedimentological data to solve problems related to tectonics and basin analysis.

Candidates for the Sun Shu Prizes must be Full Members of the IAS aged between 35-45 years. The prizes shall be awarded every two years to:

- I. A Chinese scientist (SUN SHU Prize China) and
- II. An international scientist (SUN SHU Prize International).



The award consists of prize money of €1,300 EUR and the SUN SHU medal. Winners will also be offered full membership of IAS for 2 years.

This new carbonate-focused event will take place between 12-14<sup>th</sup> May 2020 and will provide a forum for a diverse range of postgraduate and early career researchers to present their work to a like-minded audience.

Oral presentations will only be offered to postgraduate and early career researchers, and should be focused on fundamental, underpinning processes rather than the applied aspects of projects. Work that is in progress and ideas that are not yet fully formed are particularly encouraged. Presentation slots will be for no more than 15 minutes, and ample time will be allocated for discussion and audience feedback, in a supportive and encouraging environment.

# Get to know the IAS Early Career Scientists Committee Member – Pablo Suarez-Gonzalez

I am Pablo Suarez-Gonzalez, a Spanish geoscientist with wide interests in different methods and scales of Sedimentology: from the interplay of tectonics and sedimentation in basin analysis, to the fascinating petrographic study of thin sections, and even at a smaller scale with the help of geochemical tools. During my career, I have especially focused on carbonate facies and microbial deposits.

In 2015, I finished my PhD in the Complutense University of Madrid (Spain), about a Cretaceous carbonate unit with an intriguing sedimentology, right at the frontier of continental and marine realms, and with an unusual abundance and diversity of microbialites, which sparked my curiosity about the interaction of microbial and sedimentary processes.

After predoctoral stays in the USA and France, I spent a couple of years in Germany, as an Alexander von Humboldt postdoc in the Geobiology department of the University of Göttingen, learning more about the precipitation of minerals within modern microbial communities. Now I am back to Spain, as an assistant professor at the Rey Juan Carlos University, where I can continue my research exploring the connections between sedimentology and microbiology in both modern and fossil environments.



### IAS Special Lecture Tour report – Adrian Immenhauser visits the University of Saskatchewan

Adrian Immenhauser from Ruhr University in Bochum, Germany, came to visit the Department of Geological Sciences at the University of Saskatchewan in Saskatoon, Canada, on October 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup>. He delivered two lectures—Aptian Oceanic Anoxia: The shallow marine perspective and Quantitative Diagenesis: Natural laboratories and versus experimental work. Both talks were attended by a diverse audience of undergraduate and graduate students, research staff, and faculty members from our university community as well as local geologists from the Saskatoon area.

The talks were kept at a level that was interesting for those of us outside the geochemistry world but also engaging to experts in the audience. We appreciated that in addition to his lectures, Adrian took time to meet with some of our graduate students to offer them constructive feedback on their projects.





We thank Adrian for coming all the way around the world to visit us and really appreciate the support from the IAS for this lecture tour. We hope we can host a stop on the next tour.



#### **IAS Sponsored Meeting report**

## Turkish Sedimentology Working Group (SCG) 'Marine Depositional Systems' workshop 5<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> September 2019, Elaziğ, Turkey

The Sedimentology Working Group Workshop, hosted by different universities every year, was held on 5-8 September 2019 under the title of Marine Depositional Systems", hosted by the Department of Geological Engineering, at Firat University. Chairman of the Organizing Committee was Assoc.Prof. Calibe Koç Taşgın (Firat University, Turkey).

55 registered participants coming from all different parts of Turkey participated to the workshop; 33 academicians, 9 Engineers working



in Turkey Petroleum Company, 9 PhD students and 4 master students, 2 undergraduate students. A total of thirty-three presentations, two of them invited speakers, one special presentation, twenty two oral and eight posters, were presented at the SÇG-2019 Workshop. One student was supported by the International Association of Sedimentologists with a Travel Grant and presented an oral presentation.



Researchers from 18 different universities, various institutions and companies (TPAO, TEKFEN) participated in the workshop. Bryan T. Cronin from England (Tullow Oil plc) and Xiumian Hu from China (Nanjing University), invited speakers, made 45-minute presentations and shared their knowledge with us.

Following the two-day presentation program at the workshop, a two-day field trip was organized in order to see the marine sediments and related soft sediment deformation structures around Elazığ.

#### Deadline 31st March 2020 - applications for Institutional Grants

Twice a year, IAS awards an Institutional Grant of maximum 10,000 Euro, which is intended to support capacity building initiatives in less developed countries (LDCs). Grants will allow earth science departments in LDCs to acquire durable sedimentological equipment for teaching and research, or tools that can be used by all geology students. The grant application should thus clearly demonstrate how the grant will increase the recipient's capacity to teach sedimentology at undergraduate level in a sustainable way.

Applications have to be submitted via the <u>IAS website</u>. Application deadline for the Autumn 2019 Session is 31<sup>st</sup> March 2020.
